

Flexible out-of-the-box encryption policies like "Encrypt Only" and "Do Not Forward", allow you to protect sensitive information.



Secure Documents

Restrict and track access to documents across the organization, preventing unauthorized viewing or editing — even if they are sent outside the organization.



Multi-Factor Authentication

With an enhanced login process (which at higher levels of Microsoft 365 subscriptions can be customized to your organization), you'll be able to increase your security drastically.



Mobile Device Management

Control the level of access individual devices have to your account and information, allowing you to fix this issue easily.

Expected Cost Savings

To fully understand just how much you'll be saving with Microsoft 365, let's take a look at the costs associated with the traditional model of owning your software and related hardware

When you own the IT infrastructure supporting your applications, you're going to run into many costs. The costs for owning an Exchange server alone can be staggering and include:

- Hardware: Exchange server and disks (including replication 2X on-site and 1X off-site),
 warranties, and contracts
- Data Center costs: licensing, cooling, electricity, rack, etc.
- Backup: the infrastructure, licensing, and overhead with reliable retention of data
- Proactive Maintenance: patching, upgrades of applications and operating systems, configuration, and enhancements
- Reactive Support: resources for troubleshooting and restoring services

And that's all just for one application.



Return on Investment

What are the cost benefits of Microsoft 365?
